



Counterfeit pesticides seized from multiple manufacturers in Gujarat



As per the orders from the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, Local commissioners appointed by the Hon'ble court recently conducted raids in Rajkot, Gujarat and seized the pesticides that were infringing on DuPont's trademark. The raids were conducted after a case was filed by DuPont in the Delhi High Court for violation of their intellectual property rights of their popular brand DuPont™ Coragen®. Per the court orders, FTIR portable instrument was used for instantly screening the presence of hidden active ingredient in the products during the raid. In these raids, the raiding party unearthed substantial stocks of fake products and labels that were being sold under various brand names like Solgene, Corola, Corazone, Corgin, Aatank etc. Raids were carried out on the facilities and warehouses of Solar Crop Sci-

ence, Fengel Crop Science, Alina Bio Science Agronics products and Sardar Agri Pvt. Ltd. The owners of these entities were served notices from the court. Incidentally, Crime branch also had recently conducted raids in Rajkot and lodged FIRs against MDS of Apple Organics Private Limited and Krish Agri Bio Products after they confirmed presence of illegal pesticides in their products. Mr. Atul Sonara, PSI Crime branch, Rajkot mentioned that "Based on a complaint, we raided facilities of some companies in Rajkot and collected samples of products which were confirmed to be illegal from Forensic Science Lab. Based on the lab report, it seems these companies have been involved in illegally importing technical grade pesticides and FIR has been registered under IPC 406, 114 and 120B". (4)

On banning 'Jallikattu'

The Indian government has lifted a ban on Jallikattu, a version of bull fighting which has been popular for thousands of years in the southern state of Tamil Nadu. Jallikattu has become a contentious issue wherein cattle protection and rights are interwoven with human identity politics in India. Jallikattu is age old tradition. It is more than 2,000 years old and considered to be one of the oldest sports still practised in the modern era. First of all Jallikattu means sport not bull taming, 'Jalli' means coils 'kattu' means tied. Coins tied in between the horn of a bull, whoever takes the coin bag tied in between horns is considered as winner, that is what Jallikattu is all about. Over the years, the tradition was kept alive in many villages under the belief that not conducting Jallikattu would invite divine wrath. As a result, the bull-baiting sport was invested with religious significance too. Jallikattu only is a small part of the celebrations on the day of Mattu Pongal, which signifies thanksgiving to cattle. It is more than a sport, it is a tradition. The seals of the Indus Valley civilisation depict it, which is proof that this sport was in vogue 5,000 years ago. Ancient Tamil poetry, known as Sangam literature (2nd BCE - 2nd CE), has many detailed references to Eru Thazhuvuvalu (hugging the bull).



Spirits of the people who celebrate the festivals like Pongal cannot be justified but according to Justice Misra "Prevention of cruelty to animals is the motto of the 1960 Act." The 2014 Supreme Court had banned Jallikattu after declaring it to be an act of "inherent cruelty". Despite evidence that the game caused distress and pain to the animals, and even led to injuries and occasional fatalities, political leaders in the State and sections of the public often make the claim that Jallikattu has cultural and religious significance for the Tamil community. Animals are tortured and subjected to pain in the name of culture. They even stated that this resulted in the death of few cows and also detach and serious injury for many humans. What we need is an exclusive Ministry for Animal Rights and Justice, which is solely concerned with advocating and working for the recognition of the moral personhood and universal rights of all non-human species.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR SHORTAGE OF DOCTORS

The shortage of doctors and paramedical staff for the country's poor and downtrodden is assuming alarming proportions. India has the largest number of medical colleges in the world, with an annual churning rate of over 30,000 doctors and 18,000 specialists. In fact, for every 10,000 Indians, there is only one doctor. Though there is an annual demand for 30,000 specialised doctors, only 12,000 post-graduate students pass out every year. Lack of doctors in government hospitals has left patient care in disarray, besides increasing the workload of doctors in many departments. It could be because of shortage of trained manpower or even less development of basic infrastructure like roads, connectivity and banks. Vacancies must be filled through transfers and promotions, which had always been a difficult exercise in the Health Services. Trained and competent human capital is the foundation of an effective health system.

NATO, Russia and trade top the agenda for Trump talks with May

U.S. President Donald Trump and British Prime Minister Theresa May, who share an unusual bond as the products of anti-establishment uprisings, will sit down on Friday for what could be a difficult search for unity on NATO, Russia and trade. The meeting will mark Trump's first with a foreign leader since taking power a week ago, and it could go a

long way towards determining how crucial Trump considers the traditional "special relationship" between the two countries. Trump rode an anti-Washington wave to win on

Nov. 8, and May gained power in July after the "Brexit" vote that has put her country on a path to separate from the European Union. The meeting will conclude with a joint White House news conference. Trump has declared NATO obsolete and expressed a desire for warmer ties with Russia. May considers the Trans-Atlantic alliance crucial and is sceptical of Russian President Vladimir Putin. They both want to begin work on a bilateral trade agreement, which for May would provide proof of stability amid the Brexit breakup and for Trump would support his belief that he can negotiate one-on-one trade pacts.

"They both need this to be a success," said Heather Conley, a European expert at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies think tank. Trump, she said, "needs to demonstrate that he has a command of issues" while May "needs to hear strong messages of support for her vision of a Britain that works for everyone, a global Britain."

If paid duly, this amount can make a huge impact of operations of MSMEs positively. However, the problem of delayed payments is contributing to adversely impact MSME functioning. It requires immediate government attention and focus to address this growing problem: To resolve this long standing financial problem of the entire MSME sector, there is need to establish the mechanism of E- platforms on which supply bills and receivables could be offered for discounting by MSMEs to banks and other financing institutions like NBFCs and factoring companies. These platforms should facilitate the Banks and financing institutions and other interested parties to offer their competitive discounting rates for the MSMEs and MSMEs should be able to opt for the best financing sources. U.S.-Mexico crisis deepens as Trump aide floats border tax idea

The White House on Thursday floated the idea of imposing a 20 percent tax on goods from Mexico to pay for a wall at the southern U.S. border, sending the peso tumbling and deepening a crisis between the two neighbours. Mexican President Enrique Pena Nieto announced on Twitter around midday on Thursday that he was scrapping a planned trip to meet with U.S. President Donald Trump, who has repeatedly demanded that Mexico pay for a wall on the U.S. border.

Later in the day, White House spokesman Sean Spicer sent the Mexican peso falling to its low for the day when he told reporters that Trump wanted a 20 percent tax on Mexican imports to pay for construction of the wall. Spicer gave few details, but his comments resembled an existing idea, known as a border adjustment tax, that the Republican-led U.S. House of Representatives is considering as part of a broad tax overhaul.

The White House said later its proposal was in the early stages. Asked if Trump favoured a border adjustment tax, White House Chief of Staff Reince Priebus said such a tax would be "one way" of paying for the border wall.
